Nature and Purpose of the Canadian Paraplegic Association (Manitoba) Inc.

CPA (Manitoba) Inc. is a non-profit organization representing persons with spinal cord injuries (SCI) in Manitoba. Accountable to a membership comprised of persons living with these disabilities, their families and supporters, CPA employs professional staff, uses committed volunteers and encourages peer-linkages to achieve its mission.

CPA's Core Services

CPA (Manitoba) Inc. operationalizes its Mission through CPA's Rehabilitation Services Framework and the delivery of six Core Services. This transitional framework focuses on four phases: Recovery and Rehabilitation-early intervention in hospital; Reintegration-community services upon return home; Community Participation and Growth; and Sustainability-continued lifelong support.

Rehabilitation Counselling

Professional counselling services assist individuals in their return to an independent life in the community. CPA offers continuous support, information, community links and follow-up.

Service Coordination

A unique framework ensures overall coordination for the rehabilitation process, from onset through community integration.

Vocational/Employment Services

These services assist individuals to identify vocational options and obtain employment consistent with their values, skills, abilities and interests.

Peer Support

"Someone who's been there" can act as a mentor and role model to encourage and sustain others through the challenges they face.

Community Advocacy

CPA strives to create a society based on inclusiveness. These efforts involve identifying, reducing and working with others to eliminate barriers to full community participation, including leadership in prevention efforts.

Information Services

CPA provides comprehensive and relevant information for stakeholders that includes individuals with spinal cord injuries, their families, employers, community agencies, insurers and governments.

What is Spinal Cord Injury?

SCI is damage to the spinal cord whether it occurs by physical trauma, illness or disease. The spinal cord is the neural tissue in the spinal canal that connects the brain to the body below the head. This neural tissue cannot normally regenerate, thus damage to it is considered permanent.

- A person with *paraplegia* has paralysis in the lower extremities and part of the torso.
- A person with tetraplegia has, in addition, a partial or complete paralysis of the hands and arms due to a spinal cord injury in the neck area.

President and Executive Director's Report

The 2012/2013 fiscal year has been a year of both progress and challenge in meeting the ongoing concerns facing Manitobans with spinal cord injuries. CPA (Manitoba) Inc. continued to address timely issues with the direction of the Board and the delivery of quality services by the staff.

CPA (Manitoba) Inc. continues to maintain a focus on directing finite resources toward the delivery of front line services. The success of addressing the many challenges with limited resources is a result of the strong support of the Board of Directors, through its involvement in the Programs & Community Relations Committee and the Operations Committee; staff, through their dedication to providing quality services; and the staff and volunteers who, serve on other community committees and collaborate with CPA (Manitoba) Inc.

Highlights of some of the accomplishments of the past year include:

• Continuation of CPA (Manitoba) Inc. staff taking a lead role in developing service delivery outcomes for CPA rehabilitation services throughout Canada.

• Continuance of the initiatives funded through the "Going Forward Together" Agreement between the Government of Manitoba, CPA (Manitoba) Inc. and Rick Hansen Foundation. This includes:

• Collaboration in a new study investigating the validity of utilizing a grief recovery model for persons with spinal cord injury.

• One year extension of the "Stakeholder Training and Education for Pressure Ulcer Prevention" (STEP UP) Program. This program focuses on community-based health education and motivation for individuals who are high risk for getting a pressure ulcer.

• One year extension of the Aboriginal Services Coordination that addresses the priority needs in this area.

CPA (Manitoba) Inc. continues to identify important issues affecting Manitobans with spinal cord injury. It has responded to these challenges through thoughtful and deliberate action including consultation and collaboration with other community stakeholders. While there has been significant progress, we must continue to work hard on addressing current needs and facing future challenges:

• Ongoing involvement in the development of support for patients with SCI at the Health Sciences Centre Rehabilitation Hospital including a CPA ad-hoc committee to develop a clearer understanding of issues.

• The ever increasing demand for services continues to outpace current funding levels and is an ongoing challenge to be faced.

• As the funding provided under the Going Forward Together proposal in partnership with the Rick Hansen Foundation draws to a close, CPA (Manitoba) Inc. must continue to seek new sources of funds to maintain service delivery standards.

• Adapting to ongoing changes in service delivery models in the health care system in order to continue the high levels of holistic support CPA (Manitoba) Inc. has traditionally provided to its members will require new and innovative approaches.

• Further clarifying roles and responsibilities with the Health Sciences Centre Rehabilitation Hospital to improve coordina-

tion of service for in-patients as they prepare for their transition back into the community.

• Continue to secure a new location for CPA Office based on the planned move of the Society for Manitobans with Disabilities to a new location as well as the Health Sciences Centre Rehabilitation Hospital Spinal Cord Injury Unit to the Riverview Health Centre in the coming years.

• CPA National and most of the Provincial CPA offices will be changing their name from CPA to Spinal Cord Injury (SCI). CPA (Manitoba) Inc. plans to continue operating under the present name and brand identity.

• Raising the public profile of CPA (Manitoba) Inc. to ensure that those who require our support are fully aware of who we are and what we provide to our members.

We sincerely appreciate the continued financial support of our funding partners, sponsors and supporters. We thank our current and retiring board members and our staff for their dedication and commitment to providing leadership, excellent administrative assistance and professional services of the highest quality to assist Manitobans with spinal cord injuries.
